


Rosemary Peters To Obituary



Rosemary Peters To passed away peacefully at home in Montebello, CA surrounded by family, on June 15, 2024 at the age of 93. She was born on January 4, 1931, in Hot Springs, South Dakota, daughter of the late William Earl Peters and Lizzie Peters. Rosemary grew up on a homestead built in 1910 by her maternal grandfather, with ten siblings.

Her early education encompassed a multi-grade, one room prairie schoolhouse in the township of Lithia, with many of her siblings and cousins. As a teenager, Rosemary lived in a boarding house to attend Hot Springs High School (class of 1949). Known for her big heart and compassion, Rosemary obtained her R.N. Degree from St. Catherine's School of Nursing in Omaha, NE in 1954, and then began her nursing career at the Veterans Administration hospital in Hot Springs, SD. She later moved to Boston and worked at Massachusetts General Hospital during the 1950's polio epidemic. She continued her nursing journey at Harbor General Hospital, Los Angeles in the mid-1950's. Rosemary met Dr. Stanley S. Y. To, at a party in Los Angeles where he was famously playing the piano. They enjoyed nearly 50 years of marriage, and made many wonderful memories with their children, as well as traveling the world.

Her charitable nature and winning smile led her to connect with and contribute to many wide-ranging community-oriented organizations (Montebello PTA, Boy Scouts, Music Center Education Guild, Montebello Woman's Club, Cross & Crown Lutheran church, Montebello YMCA Community Garden, Montebello election committee, the Breakfast Club and the United Methodist Church of Montebello)

throughout her life. She was an avid supporter of the Arts in the Los Angeles area, frequently attending live theater and concert events.

Rosemary always had a keen eye for a bargain, and appreciated the joy-of-the hunt at rummage sales, estate sales and auctions. She found meaning and splendor in every item and sought to match it to a useful owner. She was also a great lover of animals, and no stray was ever turned away. She embodied goodwill in every sense of the word, adopting not just animals but also humans in need; this led her to host two homeless women at her home for over two years. It was this generosity of character that made her someone to emulate. Let us remember her not with sadness but with the light and love she shared with us. May her life inspire us to live with kindness, courage, and an unwavering belief in the power of humanity. Rosemary said as part of her autobiography- "When I look back, I can say that my life has been a most interesting and enjoyable one. I started from humble beginning but had wonderful, sincere, helpful and loving people to help me every step of the way. I tried to always make good choices and stay out of trouble. I knew that my parents expected me to do something worthwhile with my life."
