

The Obituary

Jackie Robinson said, "A life is not important except in the impact it has on others."

Until the day he peacefully transitioned to his heavenly home on June 6, 2022, Eddie Franklin Jones, Sr., lived his life in such a way that positively impacted others. A father to many and a friend to his community, Eddie's greatest joy was to see someone experience success and betterment.

Born on March 11, 1943 in Trenton, NC, Eddie was the third of five sons of the late John Jones, Jr., and Blanche Whitfield Jones. His brothers, Isaac and Leslie preceded him in death. He and his family exhibited excellence, hard work, care and concern for others, and love and commitment to one another. At an early age, Eddie was baptized at Hills Chapel Missionary Baptist Church.

Eddie was educated in the Jones County Public Schools and upon graduation attended Elizabeth City State Teachers College.
