She was a very big fan of the Minnesota Twins and Vikings. Homework was done around the kitchen table while listening to the Twins while Lucile ironed. After retirement, Lucile did a lot of bowling and playing bridge.

Lucile is survived by four daughters: Barbara Eggers of Lauderdale, Minnesota; Patricia Eggers of Spring Lake Park, MN; Pamela Eggers (Don Pratt) of Pulaski, WI; and Brenda Bray of Brainerd, Minnesota; five granddaughters; one grandson; seven great-grandchildren; one sister Doris Rixe of Rosholt, South Dakota; and daughter-in-law DeNece Eggers of Alexandria, MN.

Lucile was preceded in death by her husband; son James, two brothers Marvin and Ivan Neumann, and three sisters Mabel Neumann, Arlene Young and Florence Kassahn.


