Mattie, a devout Catholic, lived by the philosophy expressed in Psalm 118, “This is the day the Lord is made. Let us rejoice and be glad.”

She was born April 1st, 1937 to Leo and Adeline Schirber in Mobridge, South Dakota, the youngest of five children.
