He had a way of lighting up a room with his genuine smile. He was an avid handyman and could literally fix almost anything. He would often be found picking up garbage when out for his walks or bike rides. He cared about the environment and was fond of the saying 'leave it better than how you found it'.

Merle made those around him feel loved and cared for. He had endless patience with children and his kindness, humor and friendship were felt by all he interacted with. He was very proud of his two children and loved watching his two granddaughters grow up to be intelligent and caring adults and adored his precious great-grandchildren.


As a child of God, Merle led by example and did leave this world a better place for all who had the good fortune of knowing him.

Merle was preceded in death by his parents, Milton and Margaret Thompson, his sisters, Doreen Lois Thompson and Karen (Thompson) Dreyer.








