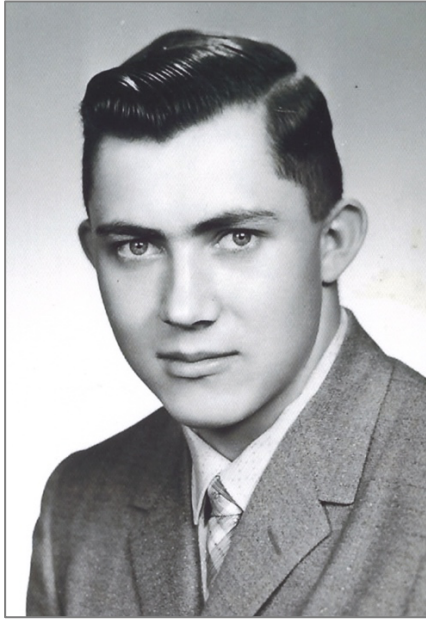

He loved the Lord and we know he is now resting in the arms of Jesus.
