#### **REMEMBERING THE LIFE OF...**

Born in Moorhead, MN, on August 20th, 1943, Allen was the youngest of seven children, raised on a farmstead outside Perley, MN to Alfred and Annie (Klusmann) Kuvaas. He attended Mayville State Teacher's College, (AKA "Little Harvard on the Prairie") majoring in Chemistry and minoring in Math; he also played on their football team, and was a member of the wrestling team. He met Carol Margaret Jacobson at a party on New Years' Eve, 1970, and they were married in rural Kenmare, ND, on August 12th, 1972. He became a science and math teacher, first at Glenfield, ND, and then at Wheaton, MN, where he was the head coach of the school's successful wrestling program from 1971-1985. In 1976, the wrestling team won the district championship under his direction. Al and his family later moved to Pelican Rapids, MN; where he worked as a financial planner for Thrivent for 33 years. He was a devout Christian, and an avid fisherman and deer hunter.

Allen Alfred Kuvaas passed away at his home, June 12, 2023, after a long battle with multiple illnesses.


