He graduated from East Grand Forks Sacred Heart High School with the class of 1964, setting a foundation for a life marked by hard work and commitment. He attended night school to learn the trade of being an electrician, a pursuit he embraced wholeheartedly. He dedicated 37 years of his professional life as a proud member of the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, where he honed his skills and made lasting friendships.

His service to his country was also of great importance to him; he served honorably in the United States Army, a chapter of his life that instilled in him values of discipline and camaraderie.

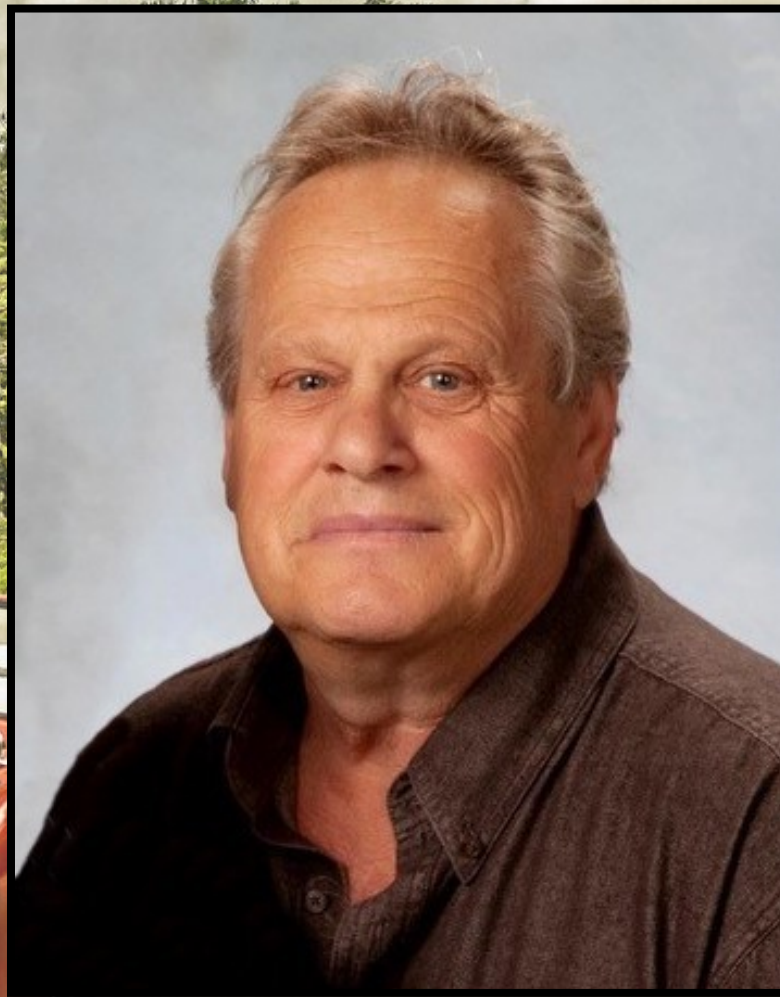
