Robert John Mork was born on December 24, 1937, in the Larimore, North Dakota hospital. He was the first in the family to be born in a hospital to Henry and Ethel Mork.

Following his graduation from Petersburg High School he followed his sense of adventure by enlisting in the army, and spent time stationed in Georgia and Arizona. After an honorable discharge from the Army he went to work for Minko Construction, and then joined Gateway Builders working there until his retirement in 2002. Retirement didn't 'stick' and he returned to Gateway Builders on a part-time basis working for his son Steve. In 2012 he officially stopped working to take care of his wife Gloria who was battling cancer.
