After Vietnam he was aboard a ship named the USS Farragut out of FL. In 1968 his brother Curt joined him aboard the ship for brother duty. Curt received orders to go to the Bahamas, on the island of Eleuthera, where Arlen later joined him for brother duty and shortly after that, he met the love of his life Elaine Wetherington. She was there visiting her sister Joyce and her husband Sandy. They were married eight months later in the Bahamas.

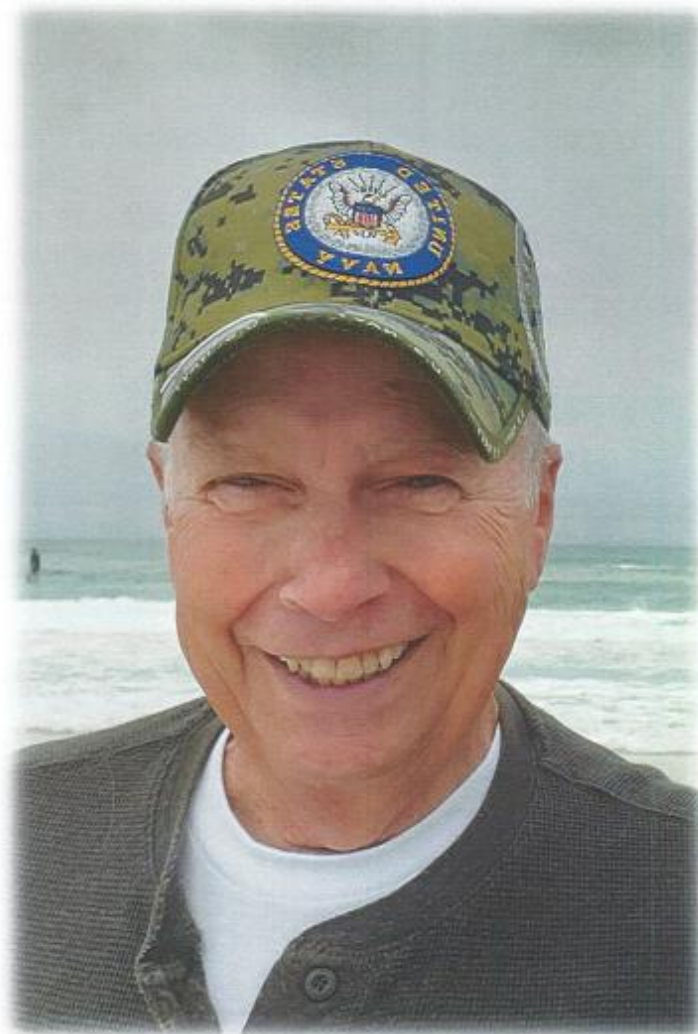

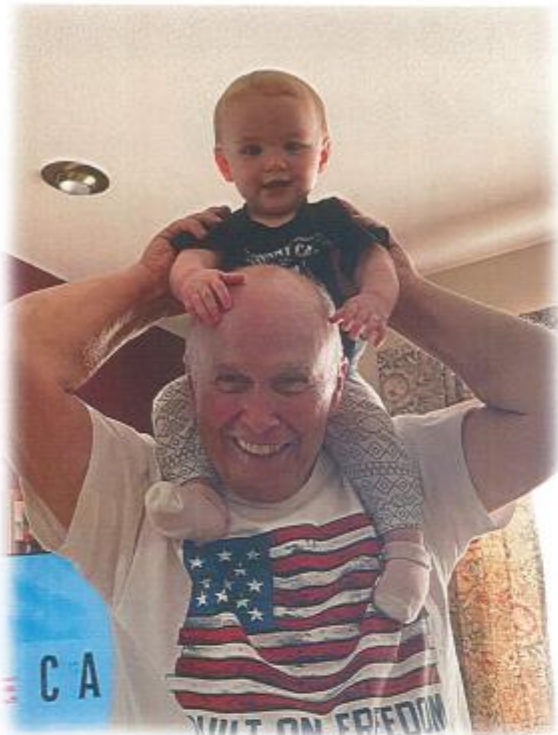
