The Obituary

Deacon Sherwood David Sauls was born in Wilson, North Carolina on August 29, 1947 to the late Elder Cutler Lee Sauls and Dazell Brooks Sauls. He took his eternal rest on Sunday, March 6, 2022. caregivers. You could not tell the difference because he loved us all. He had a love for God and was reared in the fear and admiration of the Lord. Sherwood was faithful and dedicated and a good man who will be dearly missed but always remembered in the hearts of those who loved him.
