Wayne William Buchholz was born July 17, 1935, at St. Francis Hospital in Breckenridge MN to Ernest and Helen (Martens) Buchholz. After graduation, he enlisted in the Army at the end of the Korean war in 1953. He was stationed in Fort Leonard Wood, MO for his basic training and then served at Fort Devens, MA. He was honorably discharged in September 1955 and received several awards during his service.

After his discharge from the Army, he attended Moorhead State Teachers College for 4 years. Following college, he purchased the farmstead that he lived on until he moved into River Pointe of Moorhead.

He was united in marriage to Diane Kay Radel on September 22, 1962, at Christ Lutheran Church in Mitchell Township, Wilkin County, MN. They were blessed with three children.

Wayne and Diane farmed for several years near Downer, MN and their daughters grew up on this farm. 
He was preceded in death by his wife, his parents, and his brother, Lloyd Buchholz.
