

David Otto Krumwiede, age 63, passed away on Tuesday morning, January 6, 2026, after a courageous battle with pancreatic cancer. He celebrated his birthday just one day earlier.

David was born on January 5, 1963, in Fairmont, MN, to Cleo and Yvonne (Diekman) Krumwiede. He grew up in Trimont alongside his six siblings and graduated from Trimont High School with the Class of 1981. David was baptized and confirmed at Trinity Lutheran Church in Trimont. Over the years, he worked for Rainbow Foods, Rohman Trucking, Blachowske Trucking, Kemna-Asa, and several local farms. In the years leading up to his passing, their relationship reflected deep commitment, loyalty, and a shared devotion to their family.
